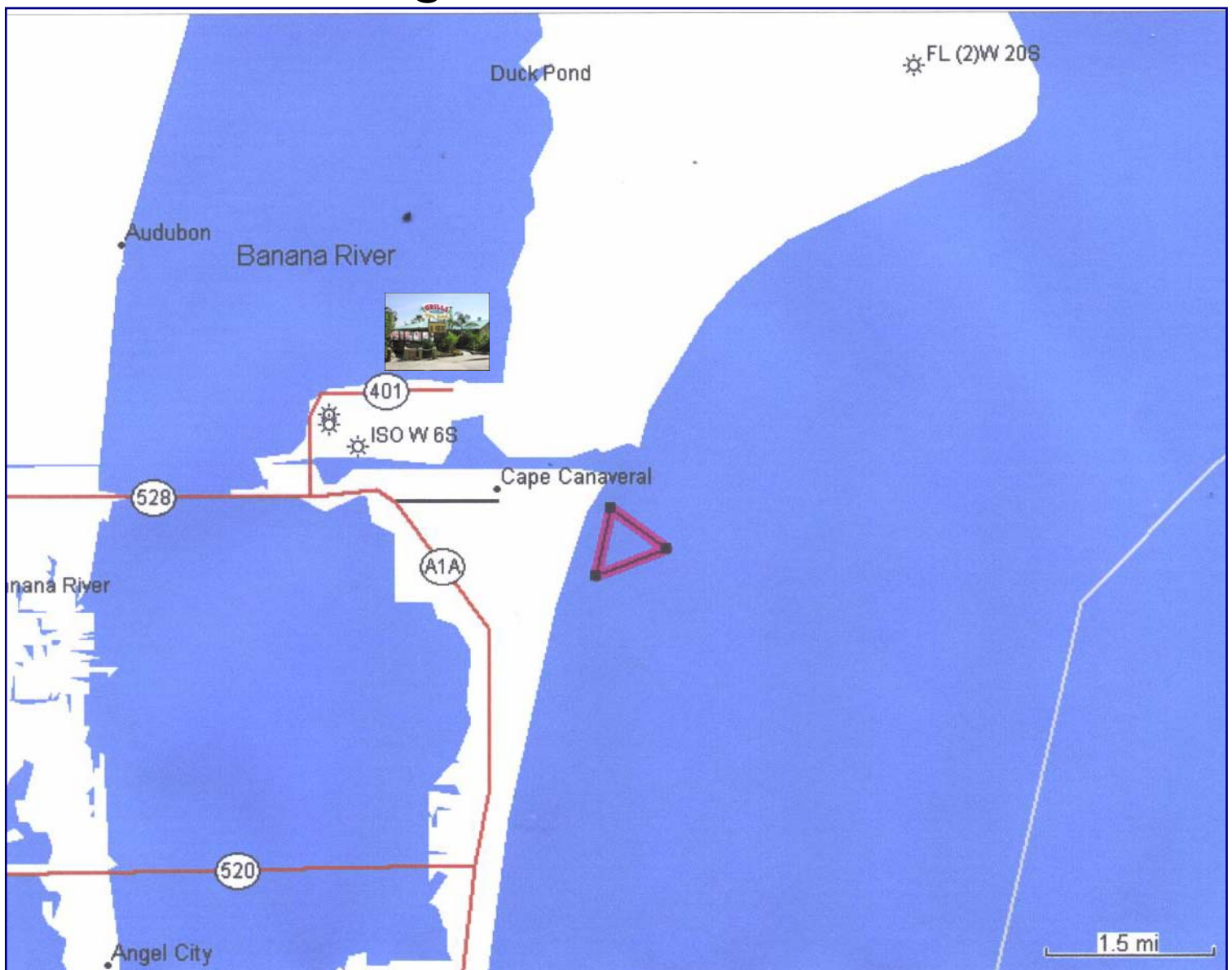

The Canaveral Port Authority has issued four regulations that must be adhered to:

- 1) No vehicles allowed on the beach,
- 2) All watercraft must be kept away from any and all turtle nesting sights.
- 3) All persons and watercraft are to be kept off the dunes.
- 4) PER THE FIRE CHIEF - No part of this event shall interfere with the guarded (lifeguard) portion of the beach.

There will be strict enforcement of these issues.

We will have crews available beginning at 12:00 Noon on Friday June 1, to start moving boats to the beach. Saturday morning operations will begin at 7:00 am. Everyone should check with the Beach Crew to move your boat to the beach. Only authorized vehicles will be allowed to move boats to the beach.

Please be courteous to all park attendants, as we intend to continue our JPOR at this venue for many years to come.

Sailing Instructions
2007 Jetty Park Ocean Regatta

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta shall be governed by the “rules” as defined in the current *Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS), these Sailing Instructions, and competitors’ individual class rules except as they are modified by these Sailing Instructions.
- 1.2 Advertising is allowed as described in RRS 79. Unless otherwise prescribed in the Notice of Race published for this event and in amended Sailing Instructions, this event shall be classified as a Category C.

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY Forms

- 2.1 ENTRY FORMS: Each entrant shall submit a written entry form with the race organizer prior to racing. Incomplete forms will not be accepted. An entry is official when posted on the master scorecard.
- 2.2 ERRORS OR OMISSIONS: Incomplete or inaccurate entry information may result in disqualification during or following the regatta.
- 2.3 SAIL NUMBERS: Sail numbers shall match the entry form and be readable from both sides of the mainsail.

3. NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

- 3.1 LOCATION: The location of the Official Regatta Notice Board will be announced at the event's initial Skippers' Meeting.
- 3.2 CHANGES: Changes in the Sailing Instructions will be posted on the Official Regatta Notice Board one hour before the first race on the day the change takes effect. Schedule changes will be posted before 8:00 PM on the day before they will take effect.
- 3.3 NOTICES: All other notices to competitors will be posted on the Official Regatta Notice Board.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from a location on the beach to be announced at the initial Skippers' Meeting.
- 4.2 If a postponement is signaled ashore, the warning signal will be made not less than 30 minutes after AP is lowered.

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 5.1 SKIPPERS' MEETINGS: A Skippers' Meeting is scheduled at 11:00 AM on the first day of the regatta and additional meetings may be scheduled.
- 5.2 CLASS FLAGS: Classes, class flags and the order of starts will be announced at the initial Skippers' Meeting.
- 5.3 START TIME: The scheduled Warning Signal for the first race of the regatta is 12:00 PM on Saturday with multiple races to follow. The scheduled Warning Signal for Sunday is 11:00 AM. The schedule may be altered in accordance with SI 3.2.
- 5.4 No races will be started after 3:00 PM on Sunday.

6. RACING AREA

Racing will be in the offshore area immediately East of Jetty Park and South of the Port Canaveral inlet.

7. DESCRIPTIONS OF MARKS AND COURSES

- 7.1 **MARKS:** The description of the marks to be used, including starting and finishing marks, will be described at the initial Skippers' Meeting and will be posted on the Official Regatta Notice Board.
- 7.2 **COURSES:** The standard US SAILING Multihull Courses will be used with a modification that allows the use of a gate on all courses. Course stickers will be available for purchase at the Skippers' Meeting. Courses will be displayed from the stern of the Signal Boat prior to the Preparatory Signal for each starting class.

US SAILING Multihull Courses (Modified)		
Course		
1	(S) A-C-A	(F) Downwind – Option 1G
2	(S) A-C-A-C-A	(F) Downwind – Option 2G
3	(S) A-C-A-B-C	(F) Upwind – Option 3G
4	(S) A-B-C-A-C	(F) Upwind – Option 4G
5	(S) A-C	(F) Upwind – Option 5G
6	(S) A-C-A-C	(F) Upwind – Option 6G
7	(S) A-C-A-B-C-A-C	(F) Upwind – Option 7G

- 7.3 **BARGING MARK:** A barging mark may be set at the stern of the Signal Boat by the Race Committee.
- 7.4 **CHANGE OF COURSE:** To change the position of the next mark, the race committee will lay a new mark (or move the finishing line) and remove the original mark as soon as practicable. The change will be signaled with the Code “C” flag and a sound signal before the leading boat has begun the leg, although the new mark may not yet be in position. Neither a compass heading, red or green flag, or a “+” or “-” display will be made, and the lack of these additional signals will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS Rule 33. Any mark to be rounded after rounding the new mark may be relocated without further signaling to maintain the course configuration. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark. Except at a gate, boats shall pass between the race committee boat signaling the change of course and the nearby mark, leaving the mark to port and the race committee boat to starboard. This changes rule 28.1.

8. RACE STARTS AND STARTING SEQUENCE

- 8.1 **START/FINISH LINE:** The start and finish line will be between a staff from which an orange flag is displayed on the Signal Boat, and the course-side of the start/finish mark, which is an orange sphere. The start and finish line ranks as an obstruction for boats not starting or finishing.
- 8.2 **STARTING SIGNALS:** Starting signals shall be in accordance with RRS 26 and as illustrated below.

RRS 26 Starting Sequence Without Starting Penalties



- 8.3 **CLASSES:** Multiple classes may be started together. Rolling starts may be used.
- 8.4 **RECALLS:** The Race Committee will attempt to hail OCS boats; failure or delay of the committee to make the hail, or failure of the competitor to hear the hail, shall not be grounds for granting redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 8.5 The Principal Race Officer is the sole person responsible for determining when races will be started or abandoned. Decisions of the PRO in this regard are not subject to redress. This changes some classes' rules regarding wind strength limits.

9. TIME LIMITS

- 9.1 **TIME LIMIT:** No race time limit is scheduled.
- 9.2 **SHORTEN COURSE/FINISHING ON THE WATER:** Under inclement conditions, the PRO may elect to shorten course or finish boats on the course in the interest of safety or completing additional races. The PRO will determine the method of finishing and the finish positions assigned to each boat. This changes RRS 32.

10. PROTESTS

Protests shall be written on protest forms available on the Official Notice Board or reasonable equivalent. Protests should be filed with the Race Committee or with the Protest Committee within one (1) hour after the completion of the last race of the day.

11. SCORING, PENALTIES, AND PENALTY SCORING

- 11.1 Rule 44.2 is changed so that the two-turn penalty is replaced by one turn.
- 11.2 The Low Point scoring system of Appendix A will apply.
- 11.3 If four (4) or fewer races are completed then no race's score will be excluded; this changes RRS A2. If five (5) or more races are completed then each boat's worst score will be excluded as per RRS A2.
- 11.4 All class rules regarding issues such as boat corrector weight, crew weight, and equipment violations are in force and the responsibility of the individual competitors to observe. The scoring penalty of DNE (Disqualified, Not Excludable) may be applied if competitors are determined to have broken their class rules.

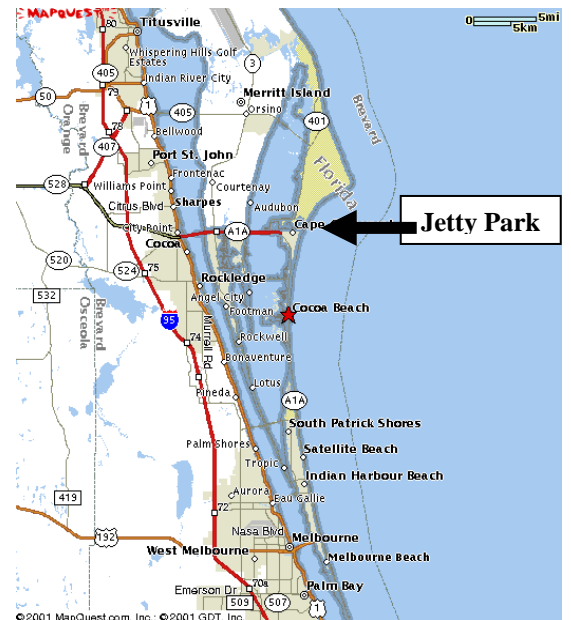
