
## **MYSTERE**


Mystere was designed as a fast, exciting centerboard catamaran with the added advantage of being a Tornado Trainer. She was designed in 1975 by Neil Cosler, one of Britain's top Tornado helmsman and past Shearwater Champion. With Sail Craft's experience, the Mystere project has provided a catamaran simple to assemble, easily maneuvered, a pleasure to sail and good value for money.

She is supplied complete with sails, ready to go, all you have to do is get aboard and sheet in. Like the Azter, she has a special wrap-over gunwhale which has a triple purpose. Firstly, in construction it provides a perfect location of the hull to deck joint and a large bonding surface. Secondly, the wrap-over also acts as an all around lifting handle (two people can lift her comfortably). Thirdly, it reduces the amount of spray soaking for the helmsman and crew, a problem with other catamarans of that size.

Her standard equipment includes all stainless steel rigging, silver anedised rotating most, boom and beams, roller mainsheet traveler, ratchet blocks and jamcleats, a 2:1 jib sheet system, 5:1 mainsheet system, mainsail downhaul and outhaul, tipping centerboards of a unique design [no rubbers required] and tipping rudders. Trapeze equipment is also part of the standard specification as is the mainsail halvard lock. A black polypropylene trampo line bridges the bulls and beams, is self-draining and unaffected by ultra violet rays. On the trampoline, there are too straps and a large storage pocket.

During her development, Mystere was sailed against many other well-known calamarans her size and out-paced many with a comfortable margin, particularly to windward. This is where those centerboards and maneuverability really pay off. Downwind she is well mannered and extremely fast.
